The advance ticket sale for TANZWERKSTATT EUROPA 2024 has started!

For 11 days, an international program of performances and workshops in Munich invites you to reflect on the art of dance and ways of living together

From July 30 to August 9, 2024, Munich will once again be transformed into a dance hotspot. The program includes 9 international productions, including one world premiere, one premiere in a German-speaking country, two German premieres and one revival for Munich. In addition, there will be discourse events and top-class workshops that will enable participants to explore artistic questions in greater depth and try out their dancing skills.

Performances

To mark the opening of the TANZWERKSTATT EUROPA, choreographer, conceptual artist and curator **Felix Ruckert** is rehearsing his piece "**RING**" (July 30 + 31) about contact and intimacy with 21 dancers. This is the second performance of the successful production since 2007, which has been shown in over 30 countries worldwide and surprises an international audience with its immersive character. The performance will be accompanied by live music from Ulrike Haage and Christian Meyer.

In addition to the solo "Panorama" (July 31 + August 1) by Catalan artist Raquel Gualtero, the first week also features two productions that describe the body in exceptional situations, but also show how it can help to build resilience: The world premiere of "Shard" (August 2 + 3) by Munich-based choreographer Ceren Oran is about how individuals and society deal with trauma. Bassam Abou Diab from Lebanon tells the story – not without irony – of how a dance with clear rules that he invented became his survival strategy during the war.

Finally, on August 4, organizer JOINT ADVENTURES and the Cultural Department of the City of Munich will ask "How can we live together?". Artistic and academic contributions by choreographer and dancer May Zarhy and philosopher Ofra Rechter, among others, will give impulses for joint reflection and an open mic session in which everyone is invited to discuss. The focus will be on the interfaces between artistic practice, the culture of remembrance and how we live together today. In the evening, Norwegian choreographer and performer Ingrid Berger Myhre will present her trio "Spelling Spectacle" in the Muffathalle. Together with two other performers, she searches for a balance between collective rules and individualism, creating a performance in real time.

Ayelen Parolin's "SIMPLE" (August 6) and Alma Söderberg's "New Old" (August 7) are also characterized by their clever wit and sometimes ruthless honesty. In "SIMPLE", the choreographer surrenders to the comical and idiotic in her search for a "simple" and honest dance and creates a piece full of Dadaist inspiration. Alma Söderberg, meanwhile, becomes personal, actually

private, when she reflects on the ageing female body and childbirth in her solo between dance, gestures, words and sounds.

On August 8, star choreographer **Meg Stuart** will be performing with jazz bassist Doug Weiss and pianist Mariana Carvalho. Like hardly any other work, "All The Way Around" provides profound insights into the movement thinking of an artist who has created completely new aesthetics in contemporary dance since the 1990s.

Last but not least, the popular **Open Stage** format (August 5) for up-and-coming choreographers and the **Final Lecture** (August 9), in which workshop participants and teachers present the results of their joint work, are also on the agenda again. The Final Lecture will culminate in a big closing party with a DJ set, where all artists, guests, participants and the TANZWERKSTATT EUROPA team can celebrate together.

Talks & Physical Introductions

The performances of the first week will be accompanied by a discursive series of talks in which international experts will discuss questions of value in art with representatives of the Munich dance scene. From July 30 to August 3, 2024, Ingrida Gerbutavičiūtė (Artistic director tanzhaus nrw, Düsseldorf), Kristof Blom (Artistic director CAMPO production house, Ghent, Belgium), Felix Wittek (Independent ISO-certified EU fundraiser and producer in the field of performing arts, Hamburg), Leen Bleys (Production manager Caravan production, Brussels, Belgium) and Kristine Slettevold (Dancer, choreographer and artistic director Cullberg, Norsborg, Sweden) will share their points of view.

For the performances of "SIMPLE" on August 6 and "All the Way Around" on August 8, Susanne Schneider will be offering her **Physical Introduction** format, which works through movement rather than words.

Workshops

In the workshops of the TANZWERKSTATT EUROPA, beginners, experienced amateur dancers and professionals alike get their money's worth. The program includes choreographic labs for intensive work with specific choreographers, technique classes (e.g. ballet, urban dance, voguing, gaga, the folk dance dabke from the Levante region), workshops in which participants learn to improve their improvisation practice, as well as bodywork classes (e.g. Feldenkrais, boxing, aikido, fighting monkey) that balance and strengthen the body. Advanced dance students from the leading training institutes in Europe can acquire career-relevant knowledge about current developments in contemporary dance, production contexts, funding opportunities and the basics of organizing guest performances. In addition, they can attend labs by internationally renowned choreographers and establish important professional contacts. The morning training sessions of the usually exclusive event are open to a limited number of professional dancers.


