

10 days of dancing: Workshops and performances at the TANZWERKSTATT EUROPA

"Why do we dance?" - a pertinent question, whose implications have been made clear to us in a special way by the Corona pandemic. What makes us dance? What do we, what do our bodies get out of it? What is the relevance of contemporary dance and performative practices for our social lifes?

For over 30 years, TANZWERKSTATT EUROPA (TWE) in Munich has offered a space to explore these questions together - practically, theoretically and above all: in a lively dialogue. This year, JOINT ADVENTURES - Walter Heun, together with the Cultural Department of the City of Munich, once again invites you to a celebration of dance. From August 2 - 12, dance professionals and enthusiastic amateurs can immerse themselves for 10 days in contemporary dance techniques, learn choreographic repertoire, develop their own material or do something for their health with Yoga and Feldenkrais.

In addition, internationally renowned artists present their work and demonstrate in an exemplary way how dance can become a starting point for a dialogue about social realities and possibilities of living together. This year's artists include Jonathan Burrows and Matteo Fargion, Frédérick Gravel, Joe Moran, Salma Salem and Marta Wołowiec, Isabelle Schad, Noé Soulier, Alexander Vantournhout and Louise Vanneste. As part of the Open Stage "Who's next?" six selected newcomers will have the chance to present their work to the audience.

This year, for the first time, the TWE offers **Physical Introductions** to the pieces by Joe Moran and Alexander Vantournhout - an introductory format that works through movement rather than words. Here, participants without any previous dance knowledge can experience the movement principles or the special atmosphere of a piece with the help of improvisation and specific exercises that train attentiveness.

A highlight in the supporting program will be the artistic-theoretical experience course in the intermediate use of the Sommerbad Georgenschwaige Fluffy Clouds. "And the beat goes on..." invites to performances, free workshops in Yoga and Tai-Chi Dao-Yin and exciting lectures around the question, how dance and somatic practices can be used to a techné for a good life. Norwegian artist Roza Moshtaghi will present the interactive art installation "Bouncing Narratives". The performance takes place on a walk-in container that has been converted into a trampoline. Artistic interventions feature Joe Moran, Louise Vanneste, the workshop instructor Luke Jessop, as well as the Munich-based dancer Katrin Schafitel, who explores the environment of the Fluffy Clouds in her colorful object costume and with full physical commitment in "ZWINK2". The internationally renowned dance psychologist Dr. Peter Lovatt, who has already shared the podium with Barack Obama and Oprah Winfrey, will give a short and groovy excursion into current research results in psychology. How does dancing change our thinking? What role does it play in expressing emotions? How can it connect people socially? Other lecturers are the dance and

theater scholar Dr. Eike Wittrock and the somatic movement educator, dramaturge and researcher Alexandra Baybutt from London.

For this reason, the Academy Camp SOLID GROUND - CHALLENGING SPACE, sponsored by the German Dance Association and the Bavarian Association of Contemporary Dance, will take place for the third time in the week before the TWE. Here, students from renowned dance academies from all over Europe will meet international experts. In training sessions, lectures and choreographic labs, they will gain insights into current artistic developments and production contexts and acquire fundamental practical knowledge about how to plan artistic processes, acquire fundings and organize guest performances. This year's instructors include Gie Baguet, Lene Bang Henningsen, Daniela Bendini, Quim Bigas, Roberto Casarotto, Marie Fol, Ian Kaler, Charlie Morrissey, Jordi Ribot, Virginie Roy and Isabelle Schad.

Performances

The performance program at the Muffathalle and the Schwere Reiter promises a reunion with old friends: Noé Soulier, director of the Centre national de danse contemporaine in Angers, has been a guest artist and lecturer in Munich every two years since 2014. For this year's TWE he contributes the opening premiere. The site-specific performance "Passages", set up especially for the Muffathalle, and the filmic work "Fragments" explore the concept of space from different perspectives and will be shown together for the first time on one evening on August 2. An even longer path of shared artistic research connects the TWE with Jonathan Burrows, who is one of the protagonists of contemporary dance in Great Britain. In the double evening "Rewriting & Science Fiction" he performs together with the musician Matteo Fargion, revealing unfinished thoughts and materials that have accumulated in their 30+ years of collaboration. Canadian choreographer and performer Frédérick Gravel takes a confrontational approach in his solo "Fear and Greed": "I have three problems: capitalism, patriarchy and why art fails to save us." Fueled by a rock band that is led by Philippe Brault, Gravel undergoes a relentless self-therapy that culminates in a sincere attempt to reconcile with the world. Louise Vanneste's "Earths" on the other hand, invites to attentive listening. In a landscape of fragrant moss, she unwinds intimate fictional stories that become physically tangible through the four performers. Their specific body language is freed from the will of construction and instead stimulates the sensual and intuitive perception of the spectators.

Isabelle Schad, who was honored with the German Dance Prize in 2019 for outstanding artistic developments in contemporary dance, presents two solos and a duet. "FUR, Turning Solo 2, Rotations" are very personal portraits of the performers and invite to dive into a process of timelessness, closeness and contemplation. Two strong artistic positions of emerging female choreographers are united in the double evening on August 10 at Schwere Reiter. In "Anchoring", Salma Salem explores the body as a subject of political power. The focus is on the uterus with its ability to endure, absorb, create and grow. "Tens", that forms the second part of the evening, deals with the body as a

source of energy. In her performance, choreographer Marta Wolowiec gives herself time to develop. At the same time, she also allows the audience to bring their bodies into harmony with that of the performer.

Things get political in "Arrangement" by the British-Irish choreographer Joe Moran. In his multi-layered choreography, six dancers question the concepts of gender and masculinity, entertain, provoke and move. In "Through the Grapevine", two men attempt to balance their two bodies again and again in a virtuosic pas de deux. The synergy that unfolds from touching and being touched forms the common thread in Alexander Vantournhout's choreography, which is located between contemporary dance and nouveau cirque.

Workshops

Contemporary Dance & Repertory Classes

This year's top-notch lineup for the workshop program includes Sandra Marín Garcia, Zoran Markovic and Patrick Williams Seebacher, who will rehearse movement material from pieces by renowned choreographers in their repertory classes. The program includes the vocabulary of the Canadian Crystal Pite and her company Kidd Pivot, Johan Inger's audience favorites "Carmen" and "Peer Gynt", and "Fractus V" by the exceptional Belgian choreographer Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui. Patrick Williams Seebacher in the urban dance scene better known as TwoFace - is offering a second course dedicated to those who want to take an intensive trip into the basics of urban dance styles such as hip-hop, popping, waving, tutting and animation.

Virginie Roy, Esther Balfe, and the Munich-based choreographers Ceren Oran and Stephan Herwig will share the joy of practicing contemporary dance. Herwig's course is specifically tailored to the 50+ generations and explores their physicality and creative potential.

Intensives & Choreographic Labs

In Intensives, professional dancers, performers and students can gain valuable insights into the artistic practice of Joe Moran, Omar Rajeh and Louise Vanneste. Alexander Vantournhout, who works at the interface between contemporary circus and dance, and Luke Jessop, long-time dancer with Wim Vandekeybus/ Ultima Vez, will devote themselves to different techniques of partnering. On the occasion of the 50th anniversary of Contact Improvisation, TWE offers a workshop with Juri Konjar and a "Contact Improvisation Jam" for all levels. Dance, exchange, play, research, responsibility and risk are the guiding themes for the jam at Schwere Reiter, which will be accompanied live by musician Walter Weh. With Munich-based dancer and choreographer Kassandra Wedel, both hearing and

deaf participants can explore dance through sign language, improvise and ultimately develop a choreography together.

Bodywork

TWE's bodywork classes are designed to do something good for yourself, to dissolve incorrect movement patterns, thereby achieving freedom from pain and expanding your range of motion. Esther Balfe is a certified yoga teacher and teaches the Hatha Yoga approach to people with and without experience, from which she already benefited as a dancer with William Forsythe. With Veronica Fischer and the Viennese expert Sascha Krausneker, amateurs and professionals can familiarize themselves with the Feldenkrais method in different courses. Feldenkrais leads to understanding the body from the inside out and to organize it dynamically and in a way that is adapted to the individual's everyday life.

Audio Description Training

In the context of an artistic diversity practice, audio description is becoming increasingly important, making more and more performances accessible to visually impaired and blind audience members. This year, the TWE will again offer a workshop with **Jess Curtis and Gerald Pirner**. It will be combined with a "Practical Experience" to aesthetically and practically explore and apply the potential of audio description at the August 11 performance of Frédérick Gravel's "Fear and Greed."



Noé Soulier constantly questions gesture as a material for thought and dance anew in his choreographies. He dissects the evocative power of movement and is also interested in its imperfections and absences: Gestures that suggest more than they show. He always adapts his work "Passages" to site-specific conditions. Here, in silence, a choreographic score unfolds in fragments based on a common movement vocabulary. This results in a series of choreographic modules of high precision.

Afterwards we will show Soulier's short film work "Fragments". In it, he reverses the usual relationship between dance and camera.

The pieces "FUR", "Rotations" and "Turning Solo 2" are part of an ongoing series by the Berlin choreographer Isabelle Schad, in which she turns rhythms and energies into choreographed experiences. "FUR" is an encounter with the Japanese dancer Aya Toraiwa and her stunningly long hair. "Turning Solo 2" brings together the portraits of the dancers Naïma Ferré and Jasmin İhraç to form a double that can be experienced simultaneously. In "Rotations", the movements of Claudia Tomasi rotate and accumulate into a flow that creates the illusion that the dancer's body is moving by itself.

We offer a physical introduction to this performance starting at 19.30 H. British-Irish choreographer Joe Moran's work focuses on the body and its presence as a site of complex subjectivities and political unrest. He often uses queering as the most important critical strategy. In "Arrangement", six dancers, complex choreography and sculptural composition, queer and disrupt gender, masculinity and full-bodied dancing – a refreshing, funny, entertaining, intelligent, provocative and moving evening.

Jonathan Burrows and Matteo Fargion have collaborated for over 30 years. Their two most recent duets are the outcome of a three year process of collecting and sifting through unfinished ideas and materials stored up over decades of collaboration. "Rewriting" is a long and increasingly complex rhythmic choreography of 108 cards, each of which carries a written thought that fuels a simultaneous spoken stream of consciousness, all of it set to music for a Casio keyboard. "Science Fiction" is a loud and looping piece of music for synthesizers, percussion and voice.

We offer a physical introduction to this performance starting at 19.30 H.

"Through the Grapevine" is a quirky pas de deux between two men. Performers Alexander Vantournhout and Axel Guérin show their bodies, stripped of all frills. They are trained but certainly not perfect. They do not try to convince with virtuous movements. Gradually, their athletic bodies collide with physical limitations. With great effort and concentration, the performers search for balance, equilibrium, and harmony without shying away from humour. They challenge one another and drive each other forward. Through constant mutual physical contact, a synergy between touching and being touched unfolds.

In a fallow land, four human beings listen to our ancestors: algae, roots, ferns ... Imagine like a plant discovering its point of view. A pleasure of imagination that mobilises the body. Salma Salem's piece attempts to reclaim the body as a subject of political power. It explores concepts of the political body through a ritualistic approach with specific focus on the womb as a political organ. From a ritualistic perspective, this solo adapts the mechanics of gathering energy from the earth; earthing the body it charges it with energy and force, exploring the idea of a center point, the main point of force in the body. Celebrating the nature and strength of such an organ that has the capacity to endure, host, create and grow.



This piece is about tension, attentiveness and calmness, as well as the strength that can always be found by standing firmly on one's feet and breathing in and out deeply.




